3 The Florida Polytechnic University Board of Trustees and the UFF-FPU recognize the various 4 challenges that resulted from the maintenance of the productive and efficient operation of the University during the coronavirus pandemic. The Florida Polytechnic University Board of 5 6 Trustees and UFF-FPU are committed to working together to promote appropriate solutions to 7 meeting our mission, which is strongly focused on providing education to our students, despite the difficulties that COVID-19 presented to the University and its faculty. Recognizing the impact of 8 9 the pandemic and its disruption to faculty research productivity, the Florida Polytechnic University Board of Trustees and the UFF-FPU agree to the following terms and conditions: 10

18		employ	yment beyond their employment contract expiration date of August 15, 2022:
19		(1)	Individuals who will be seeking reappointment or promotion via the full
20			review process, may elect to opt-out of the full review process in the 2021-
21			2022 Academic Year and conduct the full review in the 2022-2023
22			Academic Year.
23		(2)	Those individuals must declare their intent to do so, in writing, using a form
24			provided by Academic Affairs.
25			(a) All declarations for this one (1) year extension are irrevocable and
26			must be made by September 15, 2021.
27			(b) The University will provide a minimum of two (2) reminders of this
28			opportunity to faculty by email, before September 15, 2021.
29		(3)	Individuals who will be seeking reappointment via the shortened review
30			process (or equivalent) may elect to opt-out of this shortened review process
31			in the 2021-2022 Academic Year and conduct the shortened review in the
32			2022-2023 Academic Year.
33			(a) Those individuals must declare their intent to do so, in writing, using
34			a form provided by Academic Affairs.

3			(c) The University will provide a minimum of two (2) reminders of this
4			opportunity to faculty by email, before December 15, 2021.
5			(4) Individuals who elect to delay their mandatory full or shortened review by
6			one (1) year, as described in this section, will receive an amended contract
7			that expires August 15, 2023.
8		B.	Faculty who are <u>not</u> scheduled under the CBA to complete a mandatory review in
9			the 2021-2022 Academic Year in order to maintain their on-going employment may
10			elect to delay their upcoming future review (including the mandatory promotion
11			review for Assistant Professors) by one (1) year, consistent with the following
12			terms:
13			(1) This opportunity to delay the future review by one (1) year will be offered
14			to applicable faculty in the Spring 2022 semester.
15			(a) Those individuals must declare their intent to do so, in writing, using
16			a form provided by Academic Affairs.
17			(b) All declarations for this one (1) year extension are irrevocable and
18			must be made by April 15, 2022.
19 20			(c) The university will provide a minimum of two (2) reminders of this opportunity to faculty by email before April 15, 2022.
21			(2) Individuals will only be granted one (1) extension to delay their shortened
22			or full review as a result of COVID-19.
23			(3) After April 15, 2022, the University will send to each faculty member an
24			updated review schedule in order for them to maintain their on-going
25			employment with the University.
26			(4) Faculty who elect, as described in this section, to delay their review by one
27			(1) year will receive an amended employment contract that extends the
28			existing contract term by one (1) year.
29		C.	Faculty may submit a separate document, as part of their Faculty Activity Report
30			for the 2021-2022 period, to briefly describe any adverse impacts of the pandemic
31			to their research, teaching, and service.
32	2.	Othe	<u>r Guidance.</u>
33		A.	Faculty members may choose to meet with students in a manner that makes them
34			comfortable and is reasonable under the circumstances. In some instances, virtual
35			meetings may be appropriate or necessary on occasion, but this cannot replace the
36			on-campus obligation for faculty in terms of teaching, office hours, and regular

1		meeting duties. Faculty members are encouraged to actively communicate with
2		their supervisors and the University has asked supervisors to remain flexible.
3		B. As always, the University and UFF-FPU are committed to engaging in open

5		discussions may be informal in nature or may be subject to consultation outlined in
6		Article 2 of the Collective Bargaining Agreement.
