Level 1	offense may have arisen from a temporary panic or from confusion. No evidence suggests that the student or students engaged in a pre-planned violation of	Warning Letter- Student is warned of consequences of a second offense and may be required to write a letter of apology or perform another task as part of the probation. Academic Integrity Violations: FPU-5.005 3(a)- 3(I)- Zero on examination or assignment
Level 2	student or students engaged in a pre- planned or exceptionally serious violation (ie. Collusion with others, prolonged cheating on an exam, Plagiarism) of	Warning Letter- Student is warned of consequences of a second offense and may be required to write a letter of apology or perform another task as part of the probation. Academic Integrity Violations: FPU-5.005 3(a)- 3(I)- Zero on examination or assignment
Level 3		Academic Integrity Violations: FPU-5.005 3(a)- 3(I) Zero in the class affected by the violation.
Level 4	Level 2. Third Offense whether previous offenses	Academic Integrity Violations: FPU-5.005 3(a)- 3(I) Zero in the class affected by the violation and 1-2 term suspension for second offense. Expulsion for third offense.
